Four Winds Barn, Brussels

New Sites, New Ideas

We have an exciting start to the season planned for you! Do take a drive to Brussels and look for the Four Winds Barn built directly behind the renovated Carnegie Library. Bryon Morton, a retired farmer, wanted to give back to his community and took his love of barns and, with a lot of help from so many, rebuilt a barn scheduled for demolition.

The Wheel Barn is an English High Post bank barn orginally built in 1862 by Alexander Stewart. Before the structure was dismantled with the help of a team of Mennonites, each post and beam, crossbar and purlin was tagged and labelled. Extra touches added during construction make it a magical place.

What an appropriate place to hold our first meeting of the season and the topic *Repurposing Local Mills* is so appropriate for this venue.

Dave Blaney, past councillor of Huron East and newlyappointed president of the Maitland Mills Association Inc., will talk about the plans for two mills, Logan and McGuire. Both mills are in the Upper Maitland watershed and have been under the jurisdiction of the Maitland Valley Conservation Authority. There has been community involvement in the past to help with repairs but this is a big step forward that will be discussed in more detail at our meeting.

There continues to be an active love of theatre in Huron County. Our history shows us that there were a few towns where amateur theatre was not only a source of entertainment but a great outlet for those closet actors! Jim Mulhern has a great collection of Goderich Little Theatre memorabilia along with some good stories he will tell us in May.

Walking tours are the best way to really see the details of our older buildings. The attention to detail in some cases has been kept or restored in Zurich. Heather Klopp is a driving force in this area and we are looking forward to hearing the inside stories that go with the buildings.

New Publication

Congratulations to David Yates on his book *Out of the Woods, Chronicles and Characters of Huron County.* David, newly retired from teaching, has been digging around in our history and publishing weekly columns for years in the local press. It took some organizing to pick a grouping of works for publication, but the the support of the Huron Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society it was launched last November. As well as being a great read, his book greatly expands our knowledge of the history of Huron County.
