Start Digging For Huron Photographers

Hard to believe 2019 has turned the corner and is heading for 2020 already! In light of the shortening year, Larry Mohring and other members of the executive are already researching material for the annual Huron County Historical Notes. We are focusing on Photographers of Huron pre 1920.

The content for the Notes wil be organized by towns and photographer names will be indexed for quick reference. Ideally there will be a segment on each photographer which will include:

- How long in business in each community history to be initially from digitized newspapers
- In what building(s) they were located
- Photo of the premises at the time, if possible + photo of what the building looks like today
- An interesting ad for the business again, from the digitized newspapers
- An interesting cabinet card, photo card, or photo with a clear imprint as to the photographer's name and community
- A photo of the photographer (cautionary tale is the cobbler's kids with no shoes)
- Any civic or other personal involvement in the community
- Where the photographer went after disposing of the business
- When he died and where buried

There was a lot of interest in James White's presentation on the Pathfinder, the first ship in history to be sunk by a torpedo. Historical accounts of the disaster blame the engine room for not responding to commands from the bridge thus causing the sinking. James' findings exonerate the crew and show that they were congratulated by the Admiral for responding calmly to an unavoidable disaster.

Many thanks to James for sharing his wonderful information. Dr. White taught Psychology and practiced as a psychotherapist in Guelph. Since retiring in 2008 he has written a number of books and articles, plays music and is an avid oarsman. He is both a member of
