

Join us for a walk through time and see how a family grew around this creek and made a life that has been enjoyed by six generations.

The property was purchased by the Trick family in 1873 as a going concern water powered grist mill and sawmill known as Spring Creek Farm.

The water power provided by the creek and dam gave a very distinct advantage in ways other than turning the millstones. A powered buzz saw for cutting firewood instead of using a cross cut saw, electrification before rural distribution systems were set up for refrigeration and lighting, running a sawmill for cutting logs to lumber when the early alternative was a "pit" saw powered by two men (one above and one below the log).

Still today, the bulk of the buildings and activities continue to be provided with electricity generated in the mill. Day in and day out, providing there's adequate water flow, the water turbine is generating

the needs for a big portion of the property.

The farm now is host to a herd of beef cattle, a small variety of smaller animals, and lots of wildlife. Bill and Thea Trick are our hosts.

Please bring a mug for cider, wear comfortable shoes and dress for a walk in the October woods. *No rain date planned*

From the editor's desk We salute another Community Historian

Eugene McGee was fascinated by the Air Navigation School that set up north of Port Albert on Hwy 21 on the same farm he was born on. It started a lifetime of gathering memorabilia from which he wrote a book and contributed many articles to the Huron County Museum in Goderich. In 1986 Eugene organized a reunion for the ANS and eventually built two memorial cairns on the north side entrance of Port Albert with plaques in memory of the school and those who died while training there.

Eugene worked on the Great Lakes boats for about ten years and then the salt mine in Goderich. He lived on Nile Road near Sheppardton not far from the base location.

When Eugene was 80 he reached out to the community to help him find a good place for his collection. There were a few suggestions but the best solution having it installed in the Huron County Museum in 2010. A life-time achievement.

Eugene McGee of Goderich passed away at Goderich Alexandra and Marine General Hospital on Sunday, July 30th, 2023, at the age of 92. Eugene – also known as "Bim" – is one of our true Huron County Historians.

Soon after he moved to the British Commonwealth Air Training Plans' Elementary Flying School at Goderich. After the war he began a new company Sky Harbour Air Services and not long after purchased the Goderich airport. He was featured in the 2005 edition of the Huron Historic Notes
