At the last meeting......

On Wednesday June 20, members gathered in Kintail for a General Meeting and for a tour and presentation of the Kintail School.

A few photos of the visit are on the back page. The presentation portion of the general meeting was hosted by Jim Sennett, one of the organizers for refurbishing the Kintail School, built in 1892-3 and closed in 1955. The first school began as log-built then framed n 1868. Eight pupils were registered in 1900. Jim spoke of walking 2.5 miles to attend. He described many memories of the teachers and some of the mementos gathered as the school was refurbished and renovated with the rebuilding of the south wall and part of the roof.

Archives Facilities project.....

Members will recall that in 2009, the Society undertook a project to make recommendations for a competent storage solution for the many public and private family and other collections in the County.

On August 8th, David Armstrong led a presentation to the Huron County Council on the study and its recommendation requesting assistance and support to apply for a provincial and/or federal grant and begin a Business Plan for an Archives building to serve the county. The presentation was well received but was passed on to staff to prepare a report to Council on the recommendations. We will keep you advised as the issue unfolds.

Historical Notes progress.....

The 2012 edition of Huron Historical Notes is underway. It will feature the history of the village of Egmondville, The planned edition to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the village of St Helens, near Lucknow, has been delayed and will be ready as the 2013 Edition. Notes featuring a brief history of the Wingham area, and another Pot Pourri edition are also in the works.
