Archives Facilities project.....

Members will recall that in 2009, the Society undertook a project to make recommendations for a competent storage solution for the many public and private family and other collections in the County. On August 8th, 2012, David Armstrong led a presentation to the Huron County Council on the study and its recommendations to begin a Business Plan for an Archives building to serve the county. The presentation was well received. Efforts are now underway to poll other municipal staffs to get a sense of volume to be accommodated begin a Business Case and Plan for space and storage needs.

Notes about last general meeting at the Duchess Room of the Bedford Hotel Goderich on April 17, 2013.....

Our guest speaker was Paul Schmitt, a Port Huron marine historian and amateur diver, who gave a memorable recounting of the 1913 Great Storm and the damage wrought on several ships on the American side of the Great Lakes. (Susan Bennett, curator of the Port Huron Museum, could not attend the meeting.) Paul described the events planned for Port Huron commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Storm. Thusfar on the US side, plans center around exhibits at the Point Gratiot Light and the Port Huron Marine Museum and a one-day Chautauqua (an arts and culture celebration). Other commemorations are in the works and will be highlighted on the website www.1913storm.ca

Paul showed photos of some of the damaged and sunk ships of the Storm and the finding of the sunken steamer, Regina, in 1986 in 80-ft of water. Paul had done a dive on the Regina (the third diver to do so) and showed photos of the wreck as she then lay.
