Dr John Carter, a researcher and historian, presented an intriguing talk about a little known series of events in Huron County and Ontario following the 1837 MacKenzie-inspired Upper Canada Rebellion. A group of rebels found their way to the US and participated in attacks on Canadian sites, much to the consternation of both the US and Canadian governments. Part of the talk will appear as a supplement to the 2014 edition of Historical Notes. Year 2013 is the 175th anniversary of the events, termed loosely as the Patriot Raids.
